Jubilee Year of Mercy--Holy Door

On December 8, 2015 Pope Francis will open the great Holy Year Door in St. Peter's Basilica. The Holy Door is a special place for the faithful to enter the four major Basilicas in Rome, St Peter, St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls, during the Jubilee Year of Mercy. All four Basilicas have multiple doors in their porches, but the Holy Door at each Basilica is kept closed and sealed. Only during the Jubilee Year can pilgrims walk through these doors.

All over the world, dioceses and parishes alike are sealing, and then opening, their own Holy Year Door for the Great Jubilee Year of Mercy.

More information will be forthcoming on the opening of the Holy Year Door and the Year of Mercy. Parish Retreat

The annual Parish Retreat will open this year during the weekend Masses on October 17 and 18, 2015, beginning at the 4PM Vigil Mass on Saturday. Fr. William Rakowicz, SJ will be the retreat director. Fr. Bill is on the Staff of Loyola Jesuit Center in Morristown, NJ. The retreat will end on Wednesday evening. The weekday schedule is 11:00AM (Mass and talk). Evening sessions Monday to Wednesday will have a talk only at 7:00 PM.

The topics will include: Principles and Foundations—what we learned in catechism. This will include an introduction to Ignatian Spirituality. The second day talk will focus on: The sinner called to do God's work. The third day, of course, will focus on Pope Francis. The talks will be the same at the morning and evening sessions.

On Saturday morning of October 17 (Saturday) Bishop O'Connell, CM will be here to celebrate a 9:30AM Mass for parish staffs and Finance Committees and others from the Diocese for the opening of a new program for the diocese. Details will be forthcoming from the Diocese.

On Sunday afternoon (October 18) at 3:00 PM the Second Annual White Mass will be celebrated for all people who work in the medical field. This includes all staff--doctors and dentists, nurses, certified nursing assistants, technicians, hospital administrators, emergency personnel--and anyone associated with the healing profession. It is only appropriate that we host this wonderful celebration for all of these healers. Our parish is named after St. Luke the Physician and his feast day is October 18.

SEPTEMBER 1st: World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

Following on the themes of his most recent Encyclical "Laudatory Si: On Care for Our Common Home," Pope Francis has announced a new commemoration "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation" to be celebrated annually on September 1, beginning this year. In an August 6th letter establishing this yearly event, His Holiness wrote that the day intends for Catholics "to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live.'

To inaugurate this annual day of prayer on Tuesday, September 1, 2015, at 7:30 In the evening, Most Reverend David O'Connell, C.M., Bishop of Trenton, will celebrate Holy Mass at Our Lady Star of the Sea Chapel of St. Denis Parish --- the "Beach Chapel" at 554 E. Main Street in Manasquan, NJ, through the gracious hospitality of Reverend William Lago, pastor. This beautiful chapel holds about 450 people and will be an appropriate setting for this Mass as the sun sets over the Jersey shoreline. Interested faithful are welcome to join in the world-wide day of prayer, either at the chapel or in their personal prayer, and priests are invited to concelebrate.

Although the Holy Father has given us a short window to observe this World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, we at St. Luke are also hoping you'll join us in a local expression of solidarity on September 1st. Quote of the Week:

The following, "Echoes of the Beatitudes" was taken from Blessed Pope Paul VI reflection at the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth on January 5, 1964:

Now we hear its echo reverberating in the souls of men of our century. It seems to tell us: Blessed are we, if in poverty of spirit we learn to free ourselves from false confidence in material things and to place our chief desires in spiritual and religious goods, treating the poor with respect and love as brothers and living images of Christ.

Blessed are we, if, having acquired the meekness of the strong, we learn to renounce the deadly power of hate and vengeance, and have the wisdom to exalt above the fear of armed force the generosity of forgiveness, alliance in freedom and work, and conquest through goodness and peace.

Blessed are we, if we do not make egoism the guiding criterion of our life, nor pleasure its purpose, but learn rather to discover in sobriety our strength, in pain a source of redemption, in sacrifice the very summit of greatness.

Blessed are we, if we prefer to be the oppressed rather than the oppressors, and constantly hunger for the progress of justice.

Blessed are we, if for the Kingdom of God in time and beyond time we learn to pardon and to persevere, to work and to serve, to suffer and to love.

We shall never be deceived.

In such accents do We seem to hear His voice today. Then, it was stronger, sweeter, and more awe-inspiring: it was divine. But as we try to recapture some echo of the Master's words, we seem to be won over as His disciples and to be genuinely filled with new wisdom and fresh courage.
