Holy Saturday

Even as we begin this day, as we have the previous two days, with Morning Prayer at 9:00 am, it feels different. On Holy Thursday evening, we begin our celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper with joy, we have the washing of the feet and the celebration of the Eucharist, followed by the growing sadness of the journey towards the Crucifixion. This mood, this sadness, this darkness, continues to grow as we gather for Good Friday's Sacred Liturgy. Holy Saturday, there is quiet sadness, yet a feeling of anticipation is creeping in. This is seen in the Blessing of the Easter food, which occurs at 11:00 am. While this is an Eastern European/ Polish tradition, EVERYONE is invited to bring a basket of the foods they will prepare for Easter, to be blessed. The church, which has been devoid of decoration, will burst forth with the flowers of Spring and Easter Lilies in anticipation. At 8:15 pm, as the darkness (in which we left on Holy Thursday) still envelops us, on the plaza, we gather (weather permitting) for that first light of Easter, the single light of the new Paschal Candle which will lead us into the church, still in darkness. Then, as we enter the doors, led by the light of the new Paschal Candle, that light will spread, from candle to candle and person to person. We will celebrate with the Exultet and readings and psalms from the Old Testament and then, the Gloria and all lights in the church which have been extinguished since Holy Thursday, are lit and we really celebrate - ALLELUIA! HE IS RISEN!

After the proclaiming of the Gospel, we will witness the Baptism of 7 people into the family of believers! And for our Catechumens/Elect, we will witness their Confirmation and their coming to the Lord's Table for the first time. The joy and beauty of this night should be witnessed by everyone!!! And this very poignant celebration of the Lord's Resurrection continues through our Easter Masses at 7:00 am, 8:30 am, 10:00 am, and 12:00 pm and indeed the entire Easter Season, which does not end until the celebration of Pentecost (June 4th), when we will confirm those who are completing their Sacraments of Initiation.

All of the preparation for those people who either choose to enter the Church (catechumens) or complete their Sacraments of Initiation (Eucharist and/or Confirmation) are through our R.C.I.A program. R.C.I.A. stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Those who are seeking, find their way through you—you are Jesus' hands and feet in this world. If friends, family members, neighbors are seeking something more, or have been baptized but haven't completed their Sacraments of Initiation (Eucharist and/or Confirmation), extend the invitation to them, to come to Church with you and to contact our RCIA team at 848-226-6220.
