Tip of the Week

"..Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Mt 25:13

Jesus asks us to stay awake and to prepare for His second coming. No one knows if they will have another day to prepare. Preparing means making sure that we reconcile with God (live in a state of grace) and reconcile with family members or others, offering or/and seeking forgiveness. The 16th-century "apostle of Rome," St. Philip Neri, pointed out, "The best way to prepare...is to spend every day of life as though it were your last." Last Sunday, we read the Beatitudes and discussed whether there was one Beatitude we were called to work on. Could we pick another one to work on? What else could we do to "be prepared"?
