FROM THE PASTOR. . .

Those of us who distribute Holy Communion at Mass have noticed that some people have developed their own way of receiving Holy Communion at Mass. I would like to review with you how the Church says we are to receive. All of this can be found in the new Roman Missal.

Holy Communion under the form of bread is offered to the communicant with the words "The Body of Christ." The communicant may choose whether to receive the Body of Christ in the hand or on the tongue. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost (see p. 84).

It is proper to do a simple bow of the head when approaching the Eucharist. Some communicants approach the priest or minister as if they are unsure of how they are to receive. If receiving in the hand, the hands need to be raised to chest level with the both hands forming a cup or receptacle so as not to drop the host. Some people have their hands down at their belt level and we cannot see that they desire to receive by hand. Hands need to be at chest level for us to see them. It is not proper to attempt to take the host from the priest or minister while they are placing it into your hands. The proper way is for the minister to directly place the host into your hands. Please do not try to take the host with your fingers from the priest.

If you choose to receive on the tongue please extend your tongue and not merely open your mouth. Please stand straight-up and bend your head slightly back. The minister will place the host directly onto your tongue. There is no need for you to bend down or stoop. We can reach you!

While giving you Communion the minister will say "The Body of Christ." The proper response is "Amen." Many people say "Thank you Father." This is not the correct response. When you respond "Amen" you are attesting to the fact that you believe that you are actually receiving the Body of Christ. When receiving from the Cup the proper response is also "Amen."
