# FROM THE PASTOR. . .

There has been a great deal happening here at St. Luke.

We have received our first rebate from Faith To Move Mountains! We have set this first tranche of \$33,402.00 to address the roof, when weather permits. We thank you for your support!

On Tuesday, March 7th, Faith of Our Future, the Diocesan initiative to address the needs of our Church as we head into a future of fewer priests, began the next phase of preparation and planning. We will continue to update you, the faithful, as things develop.

On Thursday, March 9th, Msgr. Thomas Gervasio, Vicar General for the Diocese of Trenton, celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with 80 young adults from our Religious Education Program. It was a beautiful celebration and we ask that everyone continue to pray for these young adults that they continue to grow in faith and Christian charity throughout their lives.

On Saturday, March 18th, our Level 2 students intensified their preparation to answer the call to come the Lord's Table with Communion Fun Day. We ask that you also pray for these young ones, as they prepare to receive the Eucharist for the first time.

On Sunday, March 19th, our Catechumens/Elect will begin a new phase in their journey into the Church. Over the next 3 Sundays, at the 8:30 Mass, we will be "doing the Scrutinies". Catechumens are unbaptized persons who have chosen to take the journey to become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church and the Elect are those Cathechumens who have been blessed by the Bishop in the Rite of Election). The Scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance...and are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective or sinful in the hearts of the elect (those preparing for the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist); to bring out, then strengthen, all that is upright, strong and good." taken from 141 of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Please pray for the 4 men who will be completing their journey at the Easter Vigil.
