# Halloween, All Saints Day & All Souls Day

Do you remember when Halloween was really just FUN? Often panned as a Satanic or pagan holiday, the Puritans in post-Reformation England suppressed All Saints Day and All Hallows Eve. It is believed that anti-Catholic and anti-immigrant (Irish) sentiment, played a part in this action against Halloween—and Christmas in Puritan New England. There are often Celtic elements incorporated into Halloween such as carving turnips (Ireland) or pumpkins (United States) and going from house to house asking for treats (Soul Cakes) and dressing up as ghosts and goblins to scare away the evil spirits. In the Catholic Church, All Saints Day was first celebrated by Pope Gregory III in Rome in the early 8th century and was extended to the entire Church by Pope Gregory IV in 834. So, in the end, Halloween or All Hallows Eve is the night before All Saints Day, and THAT is the reason it exists. ENJOY IT!


It is on All Saints Day that we remember all who have gone to heaven and have entered the next life—those who are where we all hope and strive to be one day—those who are our role models and our own family saints. All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, meaning that Catholics are obligated to attend Mass. Unfortunately, Mass attendance on Holy Days of Obligation are abysmal—shame on us for letting this happen.

At St. Luke, we celebrate Mass for All Saints Day as follows: October 31st (All Hallows Eve): 4:00 pm & 7:00 pm and November 1st (All Hallows Day): 7:00 am, 8:30 am and 11:00 am.

All Souls Day is celebrated on November 2nd. It is on All Souls Day that we commemorate the faithful departed. It is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful who at death have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and by the sacrifice of the Mass. Many people will also visit the cemetery.

At St. Luke, we have provided envelopes so that you may write the names of your faithful departed and have them remembered at the sacrifice of the Mass on November 2nd at 7:30 am in the Chapel—although it would be nice to have to move it to the Church because so many of you are there—practicing a Spiritual Work of Mercy!
