2018—The Year of Grace

The wonderful season of Advent has begun. Our Advent wreath graces the foot of the Sanctuary. Its circle of evergreens reminding us of the eternity of God and the everlasting life that comes through Jesus Christ. Its 4 candles reminding us of the 4 weeks of Advent—our time of preparation and anticipation of Christ truly being born in our hearts and souls and actions and his Second Coming (Be ALERT! the Gospel tells us). Its 3 purple candles, which are lit on the first, second and fourth Sunday of Advent, representing: hope, faith and peace. The rose candle, which is lit on the 3rd Sunday of Advent, which is also known as Gaudete Sunday, representing joy.

During this Advent season, we will also celebrate The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8th. The celebration of this feast day began in 1708, when Pope Clement XI promulgated the document Commissi Nobis. The Church received a formal declaration of the Doctrine of the Immaculate Conception in the Constitution Ineffabilis Deus in 1854. December 8th is a holy day of obligation and is the patronal feast day of Argentina, Brazil, Korea, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Uruguay, Spain. Philippines, and the United States.

At St. Luke, on December 7th at 2:00 pm, on the eve of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we will bless our new statue of the Blessed Mother holding the Child Jesus. The statue was purchased by monies raised and donated by the Rosary Altar Society. All are invited to join us by the Madonna Room as we honor our Blessed Mother, whose YES brought our salvation into this world.
