# Happy New Liturgical Year

The last Sunday of our Liturgical Year—the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe— will be celebrated on November 26th. We will begin the celebration of our new Liturgical Year, with the First Sunday of Advent on December 3rd. During this year, we will hear from the Gospel of Mark, which is considered the first gospel written and is sometimes referred to as the Gospel of Suffering. This Synoptic Gospel is the shortest and begins with the Preaching of John the Baptist and ends with the Ascension of the Lord, after he commissions his disciples to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel (Good News) to every creature."
