Merry Christmas!

This weekend with our celebration of the Feast of the Epiphany, we end our Christmas Season and enter into Ordinary Time. It is the Feast of the Epiphany when we celebrate the arrival of the Magi and the revelation of the infant Jesus as a king—God Incarnate. Have you ever wondered why God made himself known to those who lived on the fringes of society and outcasts (shepherds) and to outsiders and foreigners (Magi) but not to the powers of the world? Why were their eyes open while others remained closed? Why were their hearts ready to receive Mercy Incarnate yet others remained closed? On New Year's Eve, Pope Francis asked the question: "What can the Lord give to someone whose heart is full of themselves, of their own success?" This self-centeredness-is what blinded Herod and the authorities from seeing Emmanuel-God with us.

While there are many traditions associated with this celebration including the giving of gifts, baking and eating of King Cakes, the writing of "K +M + B + the year" in chalk above the door lintel, and, if you haven't already, you'll be packing away all of your Christmas decorations including your crèche. But as we put away the 'evidence' of Christmas, what remains? Were our eyes opened? Were our hearts opened? Were we changed? And what does that mean as we go forward?

Ordinary Time will be quickly punctuated by the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. As Pope Francis also offered on New Year's Eve, let us "choose to do good, taking advantage of opportunities to give good witness that we're disciples of Christ."

And to our Lord, thank you for loving us so much, that you chose to make yourself small and vulnerable and become one of us. And may we always strive to love the same way.

Also, please remain safe and healthy in this very cold weather and with colds and the flu season well underway. And remember, it is not a sin to miss Mass if you are not feeling well.

In December 2017, the St. Luke Conference Food Pantry provided 1,135 bags of food to

179 Families consisting of 323 Adults and 77 Children. In December, the pantry gave an average of 6.3 bags of groceries to every family.

The food pantry also provided Chritmas meals to 153 families. Last Christmas we provided dinners to 129 families. This is an increase of 24 families served over last year. Fortunately we have the support and dedicated volunteers to provide this service.
