LENT

It is hard to believe but Lent is upon us! On February 14th, we begin our journey through the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. On that day, many of the Faithful come to Church to receive ashes in the sign of the cross. We are asked to "Turn away from sin, and be faithful to the Gospel." The Gospel which will be proclaimed that day, sets forth the three pillars of Lent: Almsgiving, Prayer and Fasting.

Stapled to this bulletin is the mite box for our parish-wide Almsgiving program. This year we will be working with our Diocesan Missions Office, headed by Fr. Peter James Alindogan, and supporting the Missionary Childhood Association (formerly the Holy Childhood Association). The monies raised are directed towards self-help programs involving the building of schools, the provisions of health and nutrition programs and medications, school fees, and teaching and learning resources for children living in mission diocese throughout the world.

We ask that you return your box to the designated box in the Narthex by March 30th.

There are some additional resources, including how to pray the World Mission Rosary, which some of you may remember was instituted by the Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen.

As always, we will be praying the Stations of the Cross each Friday after the 11:00 am Mass and at 7:00 pm. We encourage you to participate in the Traditional Stations but also to experience the many prayer services we offer with the Stations. We will have a comprehensive schedule for you next week. The traditional Stations of the Cross will be prayed after the 11:00 am Mass and at 7:00 pm on Friday, March 16th.

And now, the Lenten regulations....

-Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting & abstinence.


-Every Friday in Lent is an obligatory day of abstinence.

-Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

-When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

-Abstinence from meat is obligatory from age 14 onwards.
