So much has been happening in our parish and the Church that it is sometimes difficult to get all the information out to you as quickly as we would ideally like. Here is just a brief synopsis of happenings.

# All Things Temporal:

The Parish Center is getting a bit of a facelift. Last year we put a new roof on the Parish Center. Having done this, we can now give the original church a bit of TLC. After some pain, a new floor and some new lighting, our Parish Center will be a beautiful place for parish events and most especially, SOCIAL SUNDAY!

We are also proceeding with our solar energy project. All of us, as Catholics, are called to be good stewards of the resources God has bestowed on us. For us to be good stewards of the resources God has given us and to best utilize the resources provided by you, the parishioners, we are pursuing solar energy in an effort to lower our energy bill, utilize land we own but cannot develop and to reduce our draw on the power grid, all at no/nominal cost to the parish. As a non-profit, we needed a partner to accomplish this. This project has been months in development and we are finally getting closer to realizing its implementation. Agreements are in review and design of the system is underway.

### Pentecost and the Sacraments of Initiation:

Last weekend we celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost, which we refer to as the birthday of the Church. While it is always a proud and significant moment in the Church, when we witness the Sacraments of Initiation, it was particularly poignant at St. Luke this year, because we rarely, if ever witness all three Sacraments on the same day outside of the Easter Vigil. You have heard the importance of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation) which when all are received offer full membership within the Body of Christ. With that membership comes rights and responsibilities, such as being eligible to sponsor someone as they are initiated into the Catholic Church, either through Baptism or Confirmation, but more on that later.

At St. Luke, we were blessed with 8 individuals who completed their Sacraments of Initiation with the Conferral of Confirmation. The names they chose for Confirmation is written on the rocks on the table in the Narthex, along with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Please continue to pray for Robert (John), Kaitlin (Philomena), Robert (Cyril), Vanessa (Rose), Luci (Brigid), Nicole (Colette), Ava (Anne) and Christopher (Cecil). We were also blessed at the same Mass to witness Lila receiving First Eucharist. To complete our triumphant celebration, at 1:30 pm we were blessed with welcoming into our parish family, 6 new members: Matthew, Elle, Jonathan, Mila, Gianna and Brielle in the Sacrament of Baptism. For the ministers involved in preparing all of these individuals and their families for this day, it is always special, but to have it happen on the Church's birthday-when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and they went out and proclaimed the Good News, brings indescribable joy.
